- Central government announced tourism development plans of Rs. 150 crore for Gujarat even as the state government has not made any proposal.
- Beginning of Rs. 4809 lakh Kabirvad Mega circuit project work.
- Tourism projects worth crores undertaken at Kabirvad, Porbandar and Dwarka at the instance of Ahmed Patel.

Union government has undertaken tourism development projects of Rs. 150 crore at Kabirvad, Dwarka and Porbandar at the initiative of Ahmed Patel. Union Tourism Minister Subodhkant Sahay said this while laying stone of integrated tourism development project at central Gujarat's Kabirvad.

The project at the cost of Rs. 4809 lakh covers Bharuch district's Kabirvad, Shuklatirth, Mangleshvar and Angareshvar. Sahay said that union government wanted to promote tourism in Gujarat. He said that though there was no proposal from Gujarat government, central government, at the instance of Ahmed Patel, took up projects at Kabirvad, Porbandar mega circuit covering places associated with Gandhiji and Dwarka and places connected with it.
